Debate is a process that, frequently with an audience and a moderator, entails formal discourse, discussion, and oral speeches on a certain topic or group of themes. Arguments for opposing views are presented during a discussion. Debates have traditionally taken place in public gatherings, academic settings, debating rooms, coffee shops, contests, and legislative assemblies. Debates, which are typically connected to educational institutions and debating groups, have also been held for recreational and educational purposes. These discussions place a strong emphasis on factual accuracy, logical coherence, and audience emotional appeal. Rules for debating and choosing the argument's structure are also a feature of contemporary competitive debate.

Panel Discussion

A panel discussion, or just a panel, is a gathering of people to talk about a subject in front of an audience. This usually happens at academic, corporate, or scientific conferences, fan conventions, or on television programs. With the intention of being both educational and entertaining, panels typically feature a moderator who leads the conversation and occasionally asks audience questions.
