iii)Speaking- Just a minute talk and expressions for plans and decisions

Talking About Plans:

1. **"I'm thinking of..."** - Used when you're considering a plan or idea.
 - *I'm thinking of going on a trip next month.*
2. **"I plan to..."** - Used when you have a definite intention.
 - *I plan to start working out regularly.*
3. **"I'm planning on..."** - Similar to "I plan to," but more conversational.
 - *I'm planning on visiting my parents this weekend.*
4. **"I've decided to..."** - Used when you've made a firm decision.
 - *I've decided to switch careers.*
5. **"I'm considering..."** - Used when you're weighing options.
 - *I'm considering moving to a different city.*
6. **"I hope to..."** - Used when you wish or aim for something, but it's not yet definite.
 - *I hope to get a promotion by the end of the year.*
7. **"I'm looking into..."** - Used when you're researching or exploring possibilities.
 - *I'm looking into buying a new car.*

Talking About Decisions:

1. **"I've made up my mind..."** - Used when you've finalized a decision.
 - *I've made up my mind to take the job offer.*
2. **"I've come to a decision..."** - A formal way of saying you've decided something.
 - *I've come to a decision to move forward with the project.*
3. **"I'm leaning towards..."** - Used when you are almost ready to make a decision but are still considering your options.
 - *I'm leaning towards choosing the blue color for the walls.*
4. **"I'll go with..."** - A casual way to express your choice or decision.
 - *I'll go with the pizza for dinner.*
5. **"I'm not sure yet, but..."** - When you haven't made a decision but are considering options.
 - *I'm not sure yet, but I might join you for the concert.*
6. **"I've come to realize that..."** - Used to indicate that after thinking about it, you've decided or understood something.
 - *I've come to realize that I need more free time.*
7. **"It's a tough decision, but..."** - Used to express that the decision isn't easy.
 - *It's a tough decision, but I think I'll go with the offer from the other company.*

These phrases help structure conversations about future intentions, plans, and decisions in various contexts.
