

- TYPES OF SENTENCES

- **Examples for Practice:**

She runs every morning. (Declarative)

Can you help me with this? (Interrogative)

Please pass the salt. (Imperative)

This is the best day ever! (Exclamatory)

- **Declarative Sentence**

A declarative sentence makes a statement or expresses an opinion.

Punctuation: Ends with a period (.)

Example:

The sun rises in the east.

She is reading a book.

- **Interrogative Sentence**

An interrogative sentence asks a question.

Punctuation: Ends with a question mark (?)

Example:

Where is your homework?

Did you finish your project?

- **Imperative Sentence**

An imperative sentence gives a command, instruction, or makes a request.

Punctuation: Ends with a period (.) or an exclamation mark (!) depending on the intensity.

Example:

Please close the door.

Sit down!

- **Exclamatory Sentence**

An exclamatory sentence shows strong emotion or excitement.

Punctuation: Ends with an exclamation mark (!)

Example:

What a beautiful sunset!

Wow, that's amazing!
